

Support Your Child's Teacher & Build a Strong CPSC— Become a Class Parent!

If you're organized, have great communication skills and can volunteer for an average of three hours per month, consider becoming a Class Parent. It's a great way to be involved in your child's class and builds parent participation in Central Park School for Children.

What does a Class Parent do?

Class Parents ensure that teachers and CPSC receive the volunteer help needed from parents throughout the year. Each class needs two class parents, along with a Strawberry Festival parent. Class Parents will be supported by two school-wide Class Parent Coordinators.

Class Parent #1 provides in-class support such as:

- Meeting with the teacher in the first few weeks of school to determine what volunteer support is needed;
- Serving as the volunteer coordinator for the classroom;
- Organizing and distributing the early dismissal phone tree;
- Organizing teacher and staff appreciation gifts or activities.

Class Parent #2 provides school-wide support such as:

- Reinforcing communication from school committees and administration regarding critical dates, upcoming events, etc.;
- Recruiting volunteers for school-wide activities such book fairs, playground duty, and the quarterly Teacher Appreciation Luncheon.
